School Improvement Update

Priority 1: Literacy

In addition to our school improvements in literacy, we have used PEF money to purchase licences for Book Creator. Book Creator is an accessible tool that supports engagement and inclusion. It is a tool that any learner can use, however is supporting those with specific difficulties with literacy. Most classes have shown pupils how to use it, however some pupils will use it more than others.

Priority 2: Maths

This term we have started introducing Big Maths as our main approach to maths. Class teachers have started using the resources and assessments that Big Maths offers.

Priority 3: HWB

Our teachers have been engaging in peer observations to audit our classroom environments in line with the CIRCLE Framework to ensure that they are inclusive for all.
